

News from Northcote House and Fenstanton Surgeries

Firstly I would like to apologise for having to close the Fenstanton Surgery on the afternoons of Friday 6th and Friday 13th March. On both occasions we had a water leak in our treatment room which got into some of the electrical equipment and caused quite a lot of damage. Hopefully this is now fixed and I would like to thank those patients who helped me on both occasions - it was much appreciated.

Good news, our carers course is due to re-start at 2.00 pm on Thursday 16th April in Fenstanton. If you had previously signed up for the course please make every effort to attend. If you are an informal/unpaid carer and would like to know more about what help and support is available locally, please give me a call at the surgery and I will book you on to the course.

We are trying a new way of working at both surgeries. When calling for an appointment you will be asked to give the receptionist an idea of your problem and how urgent you feel it is. By giving us an outline we can then direct you to the most appropriate person to assist you. For instance: patients who have a query about medication will be directed to our dispenser; those asking for a repeat sickness certificate will have their details passed to the clinician who issued the original, who can then extend the certificate if appropriate; vaccination queries will be passed on to a nurse.

If you feel unable to give an indication of the problem to our reception team then we will ask one of the clinicians to telephone you. I would stress that the reception team are not asking for full medical details, just an indication is what we need. We hope that this will help both us and you to improve our services.

And finally, if you are planning to travel abroad please give us a call in good time to arrange your travel vaccinations. More information is available on our website. Please also ensure that if travelling outside the EU that you have adequate travel/medical insurance - medical assistance can be extremely costly.

FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL meetings, Feb. 12th & March 12th

FEBRUARY 12TH. Police report: During the months of December the latest information available, the following crimes and incidents were reported: 1 incident of anti-social behaviour; 2 incidents of criminal damage; 3 incidents of burglary.

The meeting was advised that there had been instances in the district of entry being gained into houses by removing the beading from rear windows and doors. Parishioners are reminded to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police by calling 101, Crimestoppers on 0800 555111 or in an emergency 999.

Community Infrastructure Levy: The meeting was advised that Community Infrastructure Levy payments to Town/Parish Councils without a Neighbourhood Plan are capped and that new Government legislation has now imposed a clause adding a further cap to encourage authorities to adopt a Neighbourhood Plan. The Parish will consider the possibility of embarking on a Neighbourhood Plan after April. If this action is agreed it will involve participation and commitment from Parishioners and Parish Organisations.

Huntingdonshire Local Plan to 2036: The District Council is undertaking a targeted consultation to update Town/Parish Councils and key stakeholders on the draft Local Plan. Two members attended a Consultation Seminar and reported the latest situation to the meeting. Concern was expressed at the possible implications of increased traffic through the Village with the proposed Wyton development.

Parish Council Website: A working group has been formed to produce a Parish Council website. Consideration is being given to the style and content and is at a very early stage. More details will be made available as the project progresses.

MARCH 12TH. Police report: During the months of January, the latest information available, the following crimes and incidents were reported: 3 incidents of anti-social behaviour; 4 incidents of violence; 1 incident of burglary.

Chapel Green Kerbing: Work to kerb Chapel Green to prevent the further erosion by motor vehicles, is expected to commence in the middle of April. This will be welcomed by the majority of residents surrounding the Green and in the areas of Chequer Street, Talls Lane and Honey Hill who have requested over a considerable period of time that action be taken. The Parish Council and the General Purposes Committee have reviewed and considered all comments received from residents many of which contain merit but are not viable or possible to implement as they would not receive approval from the County Council and are beyond the remit of the Parish Council. A full and comprehensive survey was undertaken by the County Council Highways and there is no perceived risk of flooding as a result of the kerbing. Neighbouring residents will be advised in writing offering a full explanation of the work being undertaken.

Horse fouling.

The Parish Council has been made aware of an increase in horse fouling particularly in the subway. The concern is, that, not only is it unpleasant for pedestrians using the subway, ultimately it will block the drains and cause flooding. Whilst it is appreciated that horse riders are not in a position to clean up immediately we would request that they do act in a responsible manner and are aware that the subway is used by others and take action as soon as is practically possible.

A14: The period for registering as an interested party with the Planning Inspectorate has now closed. We hope that as many parishioners as possible have taken the opportunity to register. The Parish Council would like to thank all who attended the open meeting on 5th March, notes from this meeting can be found on the Parish Council's website under the A14 Working Group section.

The Working Group is now preparing its detailed presentations on the route with a view to passing these to Cambridge County Council and Huntingdonshire District Council as well as being able to be presented to the Planning Inspectorate in support of our registration as an interested party.

Casual Vacancy: The Parish Council would like to congratulate Andrew Parkinson on his success in joining the Parish Council. We would like to thank the other candidates for putting their names forward and hope that they continue to be interested in Parish Council matters.

300 Year Capability Brown celebrations: We had a very informative presentation from Nigel Ferrier and colleague from Fenstanton regarding the plans being made to celebrate the 300th year of Capability Brown's birth during 2016. The Parish Council will work with Nigel and his team to look at how Hilton could possibly join in these activities. We were advised that there is a programme being made by Channel 4 on Capability Brown and that there may be some filming undertaken on The Green in June 2015. We are endeavouring to find out more information regarding this.

Trees and Ditches: The tree work has been completed and the Parish Council has received some very positive feedback regarding the removal of the tree across the pond at Cross Farm crossroads which we have passed on to the contractor.

WEEE (Wiser) recycling: A collection was carried out in February and again this received some very positive feedback from a parishioner. We are advised that a further collection is planned for November 2015 and we will look to advertise this more widely nearer the time.

Easter Cross: The Easter Cross will be placed on The Green again between Good Friday until Easter Tuesday.


Pavilion: A working group has been set up to look at what options could be viable to perhaps increase the usage of this village asset.

THE LAST OF THE FENSTANTON MILLS

In 1925 and 1933 (left to right)



This is the last of the four mills that once stood on the road from St Ives to Fenstanton. It is on the west side of the Low Road, not far from the first cross roads out of St Ives. It was a post mill with a round house, but it is now partly dismantled and only the round house and the skeleton of the body remain. The main post is of oak and rounded and is 24 inches in diameter, below in the round house it is 31 inches through and square. Lying on the

ground are a Peak and Burr stone. The round house and supports are built of 2 inch bricks. A row of modern houses now occupy this site.

Church on Fire (1921)

Sexton's Timely Discovery at Fenstanton.

Entering the Parish Church of St Peter, Fenstanton, about 5.15pm on Sunday in order to prepare for Evensong, the sexton (Mr G Cash) found the building filled with Smoke and an investigation revealed that the beautiful curved woodwork of the roof was on fire. Mr Cash promptly raised an alarm and the Churchwarden (Mr Dennis James) and Mr Quick, the schoolmaster, who lived nearby, were promptly upon the scene, as were the vicar (the Rev J Campbell) and many willing helpers.

Ladders were procured and whilst the sexton remained below, Mr James and Mr Quick ascended and gaining the roof, removed the lead in order to get at the seat of the outbreak. Mr Saunders of Church Farm, communicated with the Huntingdon Fire Brigade, who promptly turned out in readiness to proceed to the scene of the fire. Meanwhile, had the flames been extinguished with buckets of water and the brigade's summons was cancelled.

The outbreak occurred in the north transept, at the west end of the church. The pipe of the stove seems to have become overheated and ignited the woodwork, a hole having been burned in the roof.






FENSTANTON VILLAGE HALL TRUST

We held our Annual General Meeting on 10th March. In the annual report we informed the members of the public present that we had successfully applied to the Charity Commission to change the charity, which exists to provide a village/ community hall for Fenstanton, from being an unincorporated charity to a charitable incorporated organisation with a new charity number and an updated constitution. The assets from the old charity will be transferred to the new one and the old charity dissolved. This move enables the new charity to own land in its own right, enter into contracts and be viewed more favourably by prospective grant-awarding bodies. It also ensures that the trustees are not personally liable for debts incurred by the charity. It has been a useful exercise to carry out during the long wait to hear about the sale of the old Dairy Crest site to a prospective developer. FENSTANTON WI

On Thursday 5th March the Fenstanton WI welcomed Mrs Katy Dunn who gave us a most interesting talk on dyeing a variety of materials (cotton, silk, wool, linen etc) using only plants. Attending a Living Archaeology Day at Flag Fen, Mrs Dunn was fascinated to watch a medical herbalist demonstrate this craft as it would have been done by women who lived during the Bronze Age. She was amazed at the brightness of some of the colours, which were difficult to imagine being around in that era.

Deciding to give this craft a go, she used an array of 'ingredients' that included walnuts, flowers, nettle, onion skins, in fact any part of anything that grows, and produced a swatch card to show the results from her many experiments.

Looking at the samples it was unbelievable to see the difference in colours produced which depended on the type of materials and the part (i.e. root, leaf, flower, etc) of the type of plant used. For example, by soaking a piece of cloth in ivy leaves and adding a rusty nail resulted in the colour black. However, surprisingly, beetroot did not dye well at all. We learnt that by cutting plants at the end of a sunny day produced more colour during the dyeing process and the longer the material is soaked the deeper/darker the resulting colour.

Mrs Dunn also demonstrated using her spinning wheel and loom and showed us the lovely items of clothing she had produced by dyeing, spinning and weaving starting with only the raw ingredients. She finished by telling us the amazing coincidence that soon after starting this craft she discovered that her late grandmother did the same thing. Mrs Dunn showed us a collection of dyed yarns and threads that her grandmother

had produced so many years ago.

During 2015 the WI celebrates its centenary year and to mark this momentous occasion each WI in our federation has been invited to produce a pennant. These will be joined together to form the Huntingdon & Peterborough Federation's Centenary Bunting.

Fabulous Frits

Fritillaria is a bulbous genus of around 130 species found from western Europe to east Asia with about 20 species native to North America. Just one species, the beautiful snakeshead fritillary, *Fritillaria meleagris*, is native to Britain and is at its best from April through to May. A lover of water meadows and ditches, the snakeshead fritillary has bell-shaped flowers gorgeously marked with a checkerboard of purple and white; naturalised in grass, they make a spectacular show if conditions are damp enough. We have



established a small colony along the stream that feeds the Lake, but for a really good show, you must visit the Other Place – Christ Church or Iffley Meadows in Oxford! Very few bulbous genera have the kind of variety in form, colour and growth habit that is seen in fritillaries. This makes them an exciting and very collectible genus for keen gardeners. They range in colour from almost black, bruise purple and mauve to green, yellow, cream; several exhibit beautiful, tessellated patterns. Some are just a few centimetres high and naturally occur in snow melt areas in mountains – these make a wonderful display in the Mountains House of the Garden’s Glasshouse Range throughout April; some reach up to one metre often growing along woodland edges or in open meadows. The orange and yellow crown imperials, *Fritillaria imperialis*, are also at their best this month, producing circlets of bell-shaped blooms on tall stems in lightly wooded areas. Crown imperials are the only UK plant species to have been documented to be, occasionally, bird pollinated, when a Cambridge-based researcher observed blue tits hanging upside down on crown imperials in the Woodland Garden here. In probing for nectar, the blue tits effected pollination. Bird pollination syndromes are often seen in South and Central American and South African flora, but rarely in Europe. Fritillaries are also of particular interest to plant scientists as they have been found to contain enormous quantities of DNA - in fact the highest quantities known in any plant or animal species - for absolutely no discernible reason!

The Royal British Legion's Quest of "Every Man Remembered" from World War 1 – The War to End All Wars 1914 -1918

Bertram Carnac Yates – born 1889 and enlisted from Hilton

Bertram died at the age of 26, on 14th March 1915, whilst serving in 2nd Northamptonshire Regiment in the Pas de Calais. His death was commemorated during the United Service held in Hilton's Methodist Chapel and later at the Lychgate, on Sunday 8th March. His great nieces, Pat Simons and Jenny Cornwall were joined by a large congregation of both Hilton's churches and representatives of the Royal British Legion including: Barry Pattison, St Ives Chairman and Standard Bearer and Jane Crowe, Ladies Standard Bearer, Mike Robinson, Secretary to the St Ives and District, Alan Scott, Huntingdon District Chairman, Grace McLaren, Ladies Chairman to St Ives and District, Liz Lawrenson, member and Kevin Charter, bugler, who was born in Hilton.

During the service Mike Robinson gave a short address honouring Bertram and his family, brother Lenham and parents William and Mary Yates. He recited the Exhortation, "They grow not old....". Margaret Shardlow thanked Mike Robinson and his colleagues for their commitment to honouring the 176 men who went away from this area in 1914 to defend their country and who never returned. The collection of £121.44 has been donated to the RBL Poppy Appeal.

Those who wished to were then led by both Standard Bearers to Hilton Lychgate WW1 Memorial where a Poppy Cross was hung by Joan Wilding and Julie Briggs. The Last Post and Reveille was played by Kevin Charter and one minute silence was observed. We then returned to the Chapel School Room for light refreshments. Sincere thanks are offered to all the Methodist congregation for their generous hospitality.

Bertram's and Lenham's father, William Yates, first married Mary Elizabeth Perry, who probably died during childbirth, had a family of nine children. William then married Mary Blythe Gossage, they extended their family with eight more children. Both William and Mary are buried in Hilton churchyard.

We have discovered there are some strange coincidences. George Duff Gordon, 2nd Lieutenant in the 2nd Northamptonshire Battalion, the same battalion as Bertram, born in Elgin Morayshire is the Great Uncle to Mrs Di Dyke-Price of Oak Tree Farm, Hilton, he also died on 14th March 1915 aged just 22 years. Also originally Oak Tree Farm was the "Red Cow Inn" where on two known occasions, William Yates, Bertram and Lenham's father, was landlord at the "Red Cow Inn". Surely all these coincidences mean both families concerned, are surprised and honoured that their ancestors are so justifiably remembered, 100 years on?

Thank you to everyone who took part in this commemoration.
