We shall also be holding a book stall and plant stall as previous years if you wish to donate. Thank you.





Spectrum - Vicar letter for February 2020

Hello! How are you doing?

Something that has been on mind for a few months now is the possibility of opening a community café in the Church Centre, here in Fenstanton. I have been chatting to people about the idea. As I am the Vicar for Fen Drayton as well as Fenstanton I often go along to the monthly café held at Fen Drayton Village Hall, on a Saturday morning. It is usually well attended. But could we offer a similar thing here?

Of course, there are big questions to ask if a café were to go ahead. Such as, what day/time of the week? Who would come along? Who would help run the café?

I would like to offer the opportunity of some added extras if the church were to be involved in such a venture. For example – perhaps you want to find out more regarding having your child baptised (christened), or find out if you could get married in church. Maybe you have recently moved to the village, or find yourself lonely (eg bereavement, or other reason) and just want to meet some people for a cuppa and a chat.

There could be an option of asking for prayer, for you, or for someone else, or a situation. A prayer request could be made on a slip of prayer and placed in a prayer box. You wouldn't have to give a name, if you didn't want to, you could just give initials, that would be fine.

The idea of a community café is in the early stages and I would be really interested to hear what YOU have to say about the idea. If you could send me an email, or write a note and pop it through my door at The Vicarage, I would love to hear from you!

What day of the week?

What time of day – morning or afternoon?

How often should the café meet – monthly, quarterly?

Could you offer help to run the café, on a regular or occasional basis?

Would you come along?

Would you tell your friends about the café?

I look forward to hearing from you.



# Fenstanton in WW2 Part 4: Fenstanton and the Prisoners of War:

A Supplement to the Fenstanton WW2 POWs essay in the Spectrum November 2019:

My recent essay on the Polish Prisoners of War (POWs) held in the Hemingford camp and those of them who worked and then stayed on in the village to make a new life, appears to have raised a number of questions.

I would like to make clear that my essay applied to the Fenstanton POWs only and was not intended, nor did it make, any comment on the part that the vast majority of Poles played in WW2. However it has to be recognised that many Poles fought with the Germans on both the Eastern and Western fronts. Below is an extract from Wikipedia

*Polish nationals in German forces:*

*Before the outbreak of the war, Poland was a multi-nation state with ethnic Poles comprising about 68% of the population. Around 500,000 people who were citizens of Poland before 1939 were drafted into the German armed forces during the war. These were mostly members of the German minority in Poland who were considered by the Nazi authorities to be ethnically German. In 1939 during the Invasion of Poland they created paramilitary organisation and actively supported German forces in occupied Poland.*

*The German armed forces also included ethnic Poles (assimilated to various degree into German society) who were citizens of the Third Reich before the outbreak of war in September 1939 as part of the Polish minority in Germany, mostly concentrated in Silesia, Pomerania and East Prussia. These people were subject to conscription like other German citizens at the time.*

My essays for the Spectrum are always about the history of Fenstanton and its people. I only refer to national or international events to illustrate the effect on the village and its people.

# An update from Fen Drayton Lakes

## A Nightingale Sang in Fen Drayton Lakes

Nightingale is one of those species that most people have heard of, but few have seen. These renowned songsters are closely related to the robin, but are a little larger and the very definition of a 'little brown bird'. Despite their plain looks, nightingales are deserving of their reputation as wonderful singers with studies identifying up to 600 different sounds in their repertoire.

Sadly, nightingale are not doing well in the UK. They are summer visitors, arriving to southern and eastern counties in the spring from their wintering grounds in West Africa to spend the breeding season here. Data from the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) suggests that the UK breeding population has declined by 90% since the 1960s, and they have recently been placed on the Birds of Conservation Concern Red List, meaning they are at the highest level of conservation concern and at risk of disappearing as a UK species.

We are lucky to be in a part of the UK where nightingales are clinging on. In the 2018 breeding season, we located two territorial singing males on the reserve. Unfortunately, we didn't find any in 2019, but that doesn't necessarily mean that there were none.

Now that we are in the winter habitat management season, we are carrying out important work at the reserve, as guided by our reserve management plan, to create new areas specifically designed for breeding nightingale following guidance published by

the BTO and advice from other sites. It will take a while for us to see the fruits of our labour, but we are hopeful that nightingales will continue to sing at Fen Drayton Lakes for many years to come.



## **Report from the Meeting of the Council dated Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2019**

### **Precept**

The Parish Council resolved to increase their precept to £30,600 (from £28,600), an increase of £2,000 or 7%. This increase was due to the cost of employing a handyman to maintain the village assets and the increase in the cost of the street lighting energy due to the devolved responsibility from Cambridgeshire County Council.

### **Diffusion Tube Analysis**

The Parish Council resolved to continue with the diffusion tube analysis to monitor the nitrogen oxide levels. This information will be used by the Hilton Traffic Group to evidence the effect of the volume of vehicles going through the village.

### **Signage at the Ford for cyclists**

Hilton Parish Council has been working with Cambridgeshire County Council to agree upon signage to direct cyclists away from the ford due to the current slippery surface. The Parish Council have expressed their support for improved safety at the Ford and resolved to permit a sign to direct cyclists down The Grove.

### **Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Minerals and Waste Local Plan Consultation**

Hilton Parish Council have resolved to respond to this consultation and request that traffic movements related to this plan are routed away from the village.

### **Bonfire Night**

Due to a rather wet evening, the gate takings were a little down on previous years but the night was a success and Councillors thanked the volunteers who worked so hard to make it happen. At the request of a parishioner the bonfire was relocated prior to lighting to protect hibernating animals but the only animal found was a toad!

## Hilton Produce Show

Hilton Produce Show: House Leeks; Hens and Chickens; Semper (always) Vivums (living)

It is difficult finding plants for the north wall of a house. In winter, violas are a cheering sight and in summer begonias and impatiens do well; their bright, almost gaudy colours, decently restrained by the shade. I opted this winter for house leeks in the two stone mini-troughs by the front door. They prefer a sunny position, but as they are virtually indestructible, (see their Latin name) I thought I would give them a try and hoped they would live up to their names.

There is a vast range of plants and colourings in this genus, and artistic effects can be had by arranging the plants amongst pieces of brick, pebble or stone. A top dressing of horticultural grit suppresses weeds and gives the good drainage that these plants need. They are absolutely trouble free and very hardy. The plant is shaped like a rosette. The original rosette, the hen, generously begets plantlets known as chickens which can be severed from the parent plant to start a new colony. These low-lying plants can be found in fresh greens or deep reds or interesting combinations. Some grow with white hairs covering the surface forming webs that give them a further Latin name, "arachnoid" or spider.

We share our gardens with other creatures and many a gardener has expressed sorrow and anger at the destructive capabilities of the two and four legged friends visiting our plots. Returning from a week away, I cast an eye over the doorstep and attendant pots and saw the crime scene: a house leek lying on the drive, pulled up by its roots. Culprit? Most probably a hungry blackbird, clearing the ground trying to get to some grubs. It was a simple matter to replant the house-leek, but I anchored it more firmly with a heavy piece of stone.

D'Arcy & Everest nursery specialises in alpine plants and other low growing hardy plants. It is on the B1040 at the bottom of Pidley Sheep Lane. Not only do they have a wonderful selection of plants, they offer a 'make your own' arrangement deal with instruction from the owner and plenty of inspiring arrangements they made earlier. This year the nursery won a coveted Gold Medal at The Chelsea Flower Show. It is only open a few days in the year, but their website is accurate and informative, telling us they will be open on the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> April.

At the Produce Show this year we hope to have some entries of house-leeks and other succulents.

# An update from Fen Drayton Lakes

## An Upgraded Welcome Area

Regular readers may remember that we had planned and scheduled a series of improvement works around our car park and welcome area. We are now happy to report that the contractors have been in and carried out these works, made possible by a grant from the A14 Community Fund, a fund managed by Cambridgeshire Community Foundation.

A new surface has been laid to renew the worn out stretch of road adjacent to the welcome area and into the car park, which has been levelled out and had a second disabled parking space added. A clearly demarcated pedestrian route has also been added from the welcome area, across the road and down to the water's edge at the small picnic area opposite the welcome shelter looking out over Ferry Lagoon.

Why not come down one day this winter to make use of the improvements and then go for a walk around one of the lakes? At the time of writing the vanguard of wintering species has started arriving, so it is only a matter of time before they arrive en masse. It won't be long before large flocks of wintering thrushes, such as redwing and fieldfare, from northern Europe will be visiting the hawthorn scrub along the access road and around the lakes. Wigeon, a grazing species of duck with a tell-tale whistling call, will be around the lakes and large numbers of waders, particularly lapwing, will be moving around the muddy lake edges and surrounding fields. There will always be something to see.
