FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Police report.

During the period 11th March 2009 to 8th April 2009 the following incidents had been reported to the Police :-

1 breaking and entry, theft and criminal damage.

3 incidents of criminal damage.

The Parish Council urges all Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0845 456 456 4, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

Members of the Neighbourhood Policing Team attended the meeting and appraised the Council of the levels of policing currently taking place within the village. This is based proportionately to the number of identified issues, although the meeting was assured that regular patrols take place during the evening and night and a number in unmarked vehicles. Other subjects were discussed including response times to calls, inappropriate parking, speeding and the Speedwatch scheme. The Parish Council will consider becoming involved in the scheme at a later date.

Village transport links.

It is the intention of the Parish Council to enter into dialogue with the coordinator of the Nene & Ouse Valley Community Transport scheme and explore if the service offers any benefits for the Village. Parishioners may be interested in the Camshare car sharing scheme which is operated in conjunction with Travel For Work, Liftshare Network and the County Council. Full details can be obtained through the website : <u>camshare.co.uk</u>. Whippet Coaches have introduced a new timetable which provides a little more flexibility for those traveling to and from Cambridge during rush hour periods.

Parish Council vacancy.

Following the advertisement of the casual vacancy on the Parish Council no request was made to call a bye-election. The Parish Council is now in a position to co-opt a parishioner to fill the seat. If you are interested and feel you could make a contribution to the Parish contact the Clerk (01480) 465300 for further details.

Compost giveaway.

Following the success of last years compost giveaway the District Council are repeating the promotion again this year. The Parish Council has obtained a supply bags which can be collected by Parishioners from the Clock Tower from 10:00 on Saturday 13th June. The bags of compost are on a first come basis and are restricted to Parishioners of Fenstanton only (please ensure you bring some form of proof of residency) and are limited to one bag per household.

R.S.P.B. FEN DRAYTON LAKES

HILTON ACTION ON TRAFFIC (HAT)

Two petitions from Hilton residents seeking effective traffic solutions in Hilton were presented to Huntingdonshire Traffic Management Area Joint Committee on 20th April 2009.

Local Member Councillor Bates spoke in support of the petitions, stressing that the traffic problems had an adverse effect on the quality of life of residents. It was agreed that the highways engineers would investigate appropriate actions and report back to the Committee.

Further to HAT's meeting with him earlier this year, Jonathan Djanogly MP has taken up Hilton's traffic issues with Mark Kemp, Director of Highways and Access at Cambridgeshire County Council. We did not find Mr. Kemp's written response to our MP at all helpful. There appears to be no recognition of our present problems. Instead, he refers to his own department's resource limitations and to previous decisions and measures taken over the past nine years.

HAT will continue to work for effective action, but it seems that results will only be secured by continued pressure on the local authorities. If you are frustrated at the lack of progress, you might wish to express your personal concerns and dissatisfaction directly to your elected representatives. This will help to make it clear Hilton will not be deflected by the kind of responses we have received so far.

HERBIE AT HOME

He collects gardening books. No great surprise you may say but one of these books has 668 pages on plant propagation and tells us how to graft mulberries, it does not even mention cuttings and Herbie had over 150 5/7" mulberries at one time on his plot, all grown from cuttings taken intern dally on 25th July. Another published 1899 called "My roses and how I grew them" begins...

This is a book for amateurs. Gardeners might scoff at it, experts would doubtless jeer. But every word in it is the result of experience, and after all, experience is a first-rate teacher. When I began gardening I knew nothing, absolutely nothing. And I gloried in my ignorance, because then I could ask advice from everyone and I received it gratis... with the result that nothing would grow because everyone's advice differed-

Hello again! We trust you are well on the way with your entries for the Produce Show on Sunday July 19th.

If you won a cup last year we'd be grateful if you would give it a final polish and return it to Jane Hazlewood (830896) by July 1st.

Herbie Collen's Tips for the month:-Roses.

June is known as 'The Month of the Rose' - but for the show in July you will also need good blooms. This is possible if you remove dead flowers once they have bloomed and give them a high nitrogen feed – not forgetting to water them if the weather is dry.

Showing fruit.

Always leave fruit on the stalk that attached your fruit to the plant and, with blackberries, currants (black & red), cut them from the plant rather than breaking them off.

What to do this month. As this is probably one of the busiest times of the year in the garden a few tasks which are worth spending time on are:-

* Feeding spring-flowering bulbs now as this encourages new flower buds to develop for next year. Overcrowded clumps of bulbs can be lifted and divided.

* Watering is especially important for containers, newly-planted and young plants...and have you thought about a water butt both for convenience and saving money on your water bill?

* Pruning spring-flowering shrubs, tidying and cutting back perennials.

* Taking cuttings from pinks.

* Planting out summer bedding in borders, containers and hanging baskets now that the threat of frost should have passed.....but keep an eye on the weather forecast just in case of an unexpected 'nip'!

* Trying planting some of your strawberry plants in hanging baskets – both attractive and tasty...and no slugs! Peg down strawberry runners into pots of compost (peat-free) if you want to make new plants for next year.

* With the Show next month we hope that your sunflowers are growing well and that your seed tray garden entry is coming on nicely.
