

Local Weather Watch

As I write this in early February, more than two thirds through the winter, the prospects for any sustained cold spell are now much reduced, especially as for the fourth consecutive winter there have been no easterly winds. The UK can be divided into two this winter, with the northern half, having several cold and snowy spells while the southern half, particularly our region, has been milder with fewer frosts, mostly slight and with any snow of the soggy wet variety which quickly thawed.

When I finished my last article in early November it was mild and this pattern predominated until the last week when it became cold. After a very mild day on the 22nd when the temperature reached 15C (59F), two days later we had the first air frost of the season and a maximum temperature of only 8C (46.4F). The minimum temperature on the 30th was -4.4C (23.8F), a shock to the system.

The colder conditions returned after a short milder interlude in December and on the 10th, there were between 3 and 4 inches of snow (75 to 100 mm), the first significant fall for nearly 5 years. Any hopes of a white Christmas were soon dispelled as, for the second year running, Christmas Day was the warmest day of the month. Colder conditions returned shortly after Christmas and the coldest night of the winter so far, occurred on the 29th when -4.5C (23.6F) was recorded. Overall, December was rather colder and wetter than normal.

January was however, milder than normal. On 22 days the maximum temperature reached at least 7C (44.6F). It was a dull month with 15 sunless days. Frost was infrequent, the lowest temperature being -0.3C (31.4F). Apart from a transient period of snow on the 21st which quickly turned to rain, there were no other days of snow. The main event of the month occurred on 18th - the storm with no name! How the Met. Office decided that a gale which caused widespread damage, disrupted travel and resulted in extensive power cuts, should not be named defies comprehension, especially as the ones which have been named had minimal impact on our area of the country.

Such has been the mildness of recent winters, weather presenters are now calling days with averages temperatures, cold, and nights with a slight frost, bitterly cold. Of course, there are other factors which can impact on the feel of the days, such as wind, lack of sun, dampness etc., but in days gone by a cold winters day was described as being between 2C and 4.5C (36-40F).

And now a couple of curios. In a previous article, I referred to the largest hailstone recorded worldwide in Bangladesh. It would seem it has competition from one in the United States in South Dakota on Interstate Highway 90 on 23 July 2010. During an intense thunderstorm a giant hailstone measuring 20.3 cm (just over 8 inches) diameter and weighing 0.87 kg. (30.7 oz.) was collected and preserved. Luckily it fell in a sparsely populated area so no-one was hurt.

We have all heard of it "raining cats and dogs", but fish and other strange objects have also been reported falling from the sky. One concerning fish occurred during the summer of 1919 when an ambulance driver in Great Yarmouth reported that his back yard was covered in tiny fish following a thunderstorm. He got his neighbors to look and some also discovered that they too had fish in their gardens. It was thought to have been caused by whirlwinds or waterspouts sucking them up from the sea or other open water.

(A small and particularly interesting item of gossip or information):

Last month's essay was rather heavy so for this month I thought that I would lighten the mood with some extracts from the parish register, local newspaper and Miss Peet's papers which are held at the Norris Museum



From the Huntingdon, Bedford & Peterborough Gazette, Saturday 26th September 1835:

*'Hereas, Mark Bunting, carpenter, has absconded and left his wife charged to the parish of Fenstanton, in the county of Huntingdonshire. If any person will apprehend the said Mark Bunting and secure him in any of his Majesty's gaols, shall receive from the Overseers of Fenstanton, ONE GUINEA REWARD. He is about 5 feet 9 inches high, shabby dressed and much addicted to **drinking and bell-ringing**'.*

I must admit that I have a problem equating drinking and bell-ringing!

From the parish register:

1866 Marriages

June 25

KING Isaac, 85, widower, gentleman, of this parish, son of Isaac, a labourer

BEARD Mary Ann, 21, spinster, of this parish, daughter of Abraham, farmer & publican

Isaac is a curious man who obviously had a liking for young ladies! At his wedding Isaac gave his profession as a gentleman, whereas in reality he was a retired waterman, probably working on the Great Ouse. At the time of the 1861 census he was living in the London Road three houses from the Black Bull (now the Sultan restaurant). The census shows that he had a 23 year old housekeeper! Isaac died in December 1868 and was buried in All Saints church, St Ives. His young widow moved in with his son as a housekeeper!

Memorial in the church:

*To perpetuate the memory of a most amiable and affectionate child, **MARY ELIZABETH COWLING**, who died June 1st 1799, aged 10 years & 10 months. This monument has been erected in sorrow by her much afflicted parents.*

"She was like a fair flower, sheltered under the influence of an inclement sky, which never appears in its genuine beauty; but after having exhibited some few tints of its nature lustre, sickens droops and dies. Why weeps the parent with distraction wild, the sad bereavement of a darling child? Why seeks with busy fondness to retrace, the dear remembrance of each dawning grace? A dawn so fair! Alas oe'r cast too soon. How was her sun eclipsed before its noon? But though' thy MARY found an early tomb; weep not for her, snatched from the ills to come. Thy flower transplanted to a brighter clime. Now blooms safe-fenced beyond the wrongs of time".

AS well as the fantastic floral displays, wonderful children's entries, tasty bakes and preserves, we would love to see some PRIME vegetables on display on the first Sunday of FEAST WEEK, the 29th July. NOW is the time to open those seed packets and put them in trays in a greenhouse, conservatory or sunny window-ledge. You can start spinach, carrots, parsnips, or tomatoes in seed trays choosing varieties that suit your garden and your taste buds. French beans do best grown in individual pots; they sometimes sulk a little at first, but generally produce a really good crop. Kohl-rahbi, celeriac and pak-choi are less commonly grown, but worth a try.

The potatoes that have been chitting out indoors over the last few weeks can be planted out later this month along with shallots, broad beans and garlic. What a feast!

Annuals such as Cosmos, Sweet Peas, Nigella, Oriental Poppies, Heliotrope, are easily grown from seed and great for younger gardeners. They fill spaces with colour and scent, as well as helping to decorate tables and win prizes in shows.

HILTON WI

We had a very entertaining evening on Monday 12th February when Andrew Sankey came to tell us of the many ways of rethinking our gardens. He brought some slides to show us how to make the most of even a small cottage garden or to add perspective to a larger one.

He assured us we did not need a lot of equipment, only basic tools as gardens grow and evolve all the time so we will learn which plants thrive in our garden. We need to be brave and take action when plants do not cope with conditions and remove them and replant something different.

Remember when choosing plants to check if they like acid or alkaline soil or you can spend a lot of money if you choose the wrong ones for your garden. Colours are important both in large and small spaces he advised the use of pastel colours on the perimeters such as, greens, blues, pinks or white to make the garden seem bigger but nearer to the house use bright colours such as red or orange and bright yellow to add impact when sitting outside with your friends and family.

Plants like to be in drifts of white or pastels in borders such as snowdrops or achillea but the reds and bright ones like tulips or daffodils look better placed strategically at the end of straight paths. This positioning is called a vista closer as when the eyes are drawn to a certain point at the end of a path it gives perspective and depth to have a focal point such as a statue or an arbour or even just a seat to relax with a drink or two. This and repeat planting is always done in gardens that open to the public so eyes are drawn to look along paths and find a pattern which will lead you to go round a corner to see something completely different.

Borders look their best when planted in three depths ,tall plants at the back then medium then small or spreading ones at the front.

To customise your garden put pots in groups ,grow plants up walls and sheds , chat with your neighbours to trim hedges and trees and when you can swap plants with them so that everything in both your gardens will be lovely!

Fenstanton Tit-Bits: By John Deeks

From Gertrude Peet's Papers (unfortunately they are undated):

"When Mrs Tebbit reached the George Inn, she stopped to read the bill that was plackarded up there. "A special coach will start from this hotel each day of the St Ives races, in time to see the Cock fights" in the Crown yard, at 11 o'clock, before the races, which start at 4 o'clock on St Ives Meadows, which was as good a two mile course as most in England. A regular match at cock-fighting will be fought at the Crown during the sales" Oh dear, she said and that's in August, just when the corn wants getting up.

Just then Mrs Tebbit caught sight of Mrs Butler's Sedan Chair, being carried from Oaklands (house), Mrs Butler not being much of a walker, always used her grandmother's Sedan Chair, she did not mind if it was fashion or not. Mrs Butler on seeing Mrs Tebbit immediately had her footmen stop and set down the chair and the Sedan door opened. She called to ask Mrs Tebbit how she was and admire Jonnie (her child). Mrs Tebbit made a curtsey and was pleased to see Mrs Butler".

Mrs Butler did not live in Oaklands House and was probably visiting with the Coote family. The only suitable Butlers that I can find lived in St Ives. I wonder if the footmen had to carry the Sedan chair all that way!
