# Parish Council Report

## HILTON

Following a number of complementary comments about the village web site from former residents, it has been agreed to set up an archive of photographs, documents and maps etc showing Hilton now and in the past. A number of residents have already contributed some interesting material and the search goes on for more. If you have any material which you believe may be of interest, then please contact the editorial staff.

The A14 Action Group held a very successful fund raising quiz and raffle on 29 September to help pay for the advice from an acoustic expert. The Action Group would like to thank all those who took part or help in these events.

Earlier the Parish Council had announced its intention to ban fishing in the village ponds. However, many residents have complained that fishing should continue to be allowed especially for the benefit of youngsters. The Parish Council is still concerned about the extent of "professional fishing that occurs but has agreed to re examine its earlier decision in the light of the strength of feeling in the village.

The village bonfire night will be held this year on Saturday 3 November.

Following the resignation of Mr Adams, a vacancy exists for a seat on the Parish Councillor. Anyone interested in filling this position is asked to contact the Parish Clerk on 01480 832030.

A number of comments have been made by residents about the extent of the vegetation along the edges of ditches and verges. It seems that the wet summer this year has created exceptional growing conditions for such plants as brambles. As part of its routine maintenance plan, the Parish Council will make arrangements for some of the excess vegetation to be cut back early next year. The Parish Council wishes to advise that the ditches themselves are generally in good order for their purpose of carrying away surface water. Some bottom clearing is need and this too will be carried out early in the New Year.

As a tail piece, the Council is still receiving complaints from residents about dog droppings all around the village. Dog mess is unhealthy as well as unsightly and residents are again urged to bag up their dog's mess and put it in the appropriate bin for collection.

**Held 11th October 2007**

## **Police report.**

During the period 13th June to 11th July 2007 the following incidents had been reported to the Police :- 1 theft from a lorry. 1 breaking and entering (nothing stolen) and 1 attempted shoplifting. A PCSO attended the meeting and gave an update on action being taken within the village. Concern was expressed at the number of vehicles parking on the double yellow lines in Bell Lane. The meeting was advised that, where possible, action would be taken against offending vehicles. Concern was also raised at the number of vehicles speeding on the High Street and the Low Road.

## **Headlands Park Play Area.**

Consultations have been taking place with play equipment manufacturers to determine what needs to be done to bring the play area to a suitable standard and the most suitable type of equipment to install. Once the initial proposals and quotations are received the Parish Council will be able to consider and discuss further the options available. Grant funding will be essential to finance this project and several possible sources of assistance have been identified. Once a definitive cost is known applications will be submitted.

## **Annual pond clean.**

The Parish Council would like to extend its thanks to those who assisted in the annual pond clean on the 13th October and look forward to seeing you all again next year! Mr Hobbs, from Hinchbrooke Country Park, is very complimentary about the condition of the pond and feels it is one of the best in the District.

The Parish Council urgently requires a Small Works Contractor on an ad hoc basis. Duties include the repair and maintenance of Parish property and general hedge/tree and grass cutting. ## **The annual ‘Love in a box’ Christmas box scheme – now underway**

### **About the scheme**

Those of you in Fen Drayton, Fenstanton and Hilton who would like to support this year’s ‘Love in a Box’ scheme, boxes are now being collected by Jenny Stimpson c/o the Fenstanton United Reform Church and the Brownies pack and Alison Fox in Fen Drayton.

The boxes are being collected for the charity Mustard Seed Relief Missions who distribute them to orphans in Iraq, the Ukraine, Croatia and Bosnia in time for Christmas. Information and spare copies of the leaflets are available from Jenny or Alison. Please feel free to photocopy the relevant parts if you have access to a leaflet already distributed.

### **A reminder of how to put together a box**

Each box is to target a boy or girl and an age-group (3-5, 6-11 and 12-15 years). The children appreciate paper and pencils, small games (for example dolls, puzzles and cars), sweets and toiletries (including soap, flannels, toothpaste and toothbrushes). Hats and gloves are the only clothing suggested. No electrical, war-related or clothing items are suitable and the charity does not recommend including books for older children. Having gathered these, the idea is

to fill a shoe-box wrapped in wrapping paper – in a way that it can still be opened and checked – and secured with an elastic band. Affix a label to the top to indicate the box’s suitability. The charity then ask that £1.50 be taped under the lid to go towards its onward transport by volunteers to Eastern Europe.

### **The target date**

The deadline for completing boxes is the week after half-term ie by 1<sup>st</sup> November. Return boxes to Jenny Stimpson or Alison Fox (see collection points above). We are hoping to send 100 boxes this year.

Once again thank you to all our helpers, and if you are able to volunteer to help at a session please add your name to the calendar at pre-school.



## **RSPB Fen Drayton Lakes Nature Reserve**

November is the start of winter for most people. The clocks have changed and if we work office hours, we come home in the dark. The weather usually seems miserable – dull, damp or wet, cold, days, and not inspiring for a walk. However, wrap up well, put on your boots and head for the lakes - there are some wonderful ducks to look out for.

Goldeneyes are winter visitors to our area. Their arrival varies from year to year, depending on weather conditions further north. Occasionally, the first ones arrive in late October, but November is when the majority arrive, and most of them head for the southern side of Elney Lake.

Males are black and white, the females are brown and grey, but both sexes have golden eyes, and bulbous heads – quite different in shape from our other ducks. They dive for their food, usually molluscs, in the deep water away from the shores, often surfacing well away from the point where they went under.

Goldeneyes breed all around the northern hemisphere, in old coniferous forests with many pools and small lakes, using abandoned woodpecker holes. Even though goldeneyes are small (for ducks), they are too big to fit through the holes made by any of the British woodpecker species. The crow-sized black woodpeckers of Scandinavia make the right-sized holes for the goldeneyes.

Laplanders began making nest boxes for goldeneyes about 200 years ago, so they could harvest the eggs. This knowledge was the inspiration for putting up nest boxes in Speyside in the early 1970s. Goldeneyes took to them at once, and have become established, with a breeding population of

about 200 pairs by the turn of the millennium.
